



Drawing Mobility Equipment

Whizz-Kidz mobility therapists assess each child not only on their clinical requirements but also on their social, educational and lifestyle needs. Working together with the child's families they select the most appropriate equipment.

Manual Wheelchair

The large rear wheels, usually propelled by the user or are pushed by a carer, make the manual chair very stable.

Many of the manual wheelchairs provided by Whizz-Kidz are lightweight to enable young people or their carers to move them more efficiently. This reduces strain on joints and maximises muscle strength.

Powered Wheelchair

This type of equipment provides a child with ease of movement, speed and enjoyment.

Powered wheelchairs provide mobility that can help to develop independence.

Powered wheelchairs have wide chunky wheels for a stability and comfort.

They are suitable for people with very active lifestyles, enabling access to most outdoor environments.

Trike

Cycling is good exercise that can improve posture and co-ordination.

It is also a leisure activity that can be enjoyed with friends and the entire family.

Specially designed cycles are suitable for children who find conventional cycles (with or without stabilisers) difficult and need additional support to enjoy cycling.

This trike has three wheels for increased stability, two at the back, and a low frame or swivel seat will make it easier to get on and off the trike.
