

# Whizz Kidz quiz night



Hosting a quiz night is one of the most popular ways Whizz Kidz supporters raise money. Here are our top tips.

First, and most importantly, **find a venue**. This could be your **workplace, a local pub or a community hall**. Pubs are often happy to give you the space free of charge as you will be bringing in customers for them, especially if it's on a quiet night like a Monday.

**Set a date**. Opt for a weeknight. Make sure your night doesn't clash with any major sporting events or occasions.

**Spread the word** about your quiz for a good cause. Send an email and use social media to recruit teams and players.



## On the night

- **Charge an entrance fee** (we recommend £5 per person). Pro tip: If you're hosting in a venue that offers food, see if they would be willing to lay on a buffet table. Often, the money spent on drinks will offset the cost of food.
- **Find a quiz master**. If you don't want to take on this role yourself, enlist a friend who enjoys being the centre of attention. Make sure they remind everyone that you are supporting Whizz Kidz, and you could even [share video](#) on the night to encourage extra donations.
- **Get your questions and answers ready**. There are loads online, or you could write your own!
- **Boost your fundraising** by running a raffle at your quiz night. Ask friends and local businesses to donate prizes and sell tickets on the night.
- **Get a prize for the winning team**. Whether it is a round of drinks, a novelty trophy or a gift basket, this will bring out the competitive side of your teams.
- **Make a plan for checking answers**. Teams could swap answer sheets and mark each other's to save you a job.
- **Keep your donations safe**. Afterwards, count up what you've made (it's important to have a witness). Make sure any coins and notes donated are kept in a secure place, and if you are going to be carrying money, then try to have someone with you, and they can be [donated to Whizz Kidz here](#) – don't forget to let everyone know how much was raised!
